Alex Rose's "Mono No Aware" at Envoy Enterprises, 131 Chrystie Street, New York, Through May 13, Wednesday – Sunday 12:00 p.m. – 6:00 p.m.

The painfully elusive and private artist, Alex Rose, has his second show (ever) at Envoy Enterprises. Do not miss a rare chance to see haunting work so personal that it will most likely be burned immediately after de-installation, and re-purposed into new pieces. Do not expect to see the artist at the opening though.

Tim Hetherington at Yossi Milo Gallery, 245 Tenth Ave., New York, Through May 19th

Photographs from Liberia and Afghanistan by the esteemed Vanity Fair photojournalist and Oscar-nominated filmmaker. In addition to the showings of the short films "Diary" and "Sleeping Soldiers," exhibition includes portraits of combatants, haunting interiors, harrowing landscapes of wartime detritus. It coincides with the one year anniversary of Hetherington's passing while covering the Libyan civil war.
